VYLI's Summer Institute is a week-long intensive training, the centerpiece of our year-round program where we train young and emerging leaders to build a new Vieques. The 3rd annual Summer Institute was a great success -- fifty young people (ages 11-17) had the opportunity to learn how to make their dreams come true. Every morning they expressed their ideas through art and writing exercises, then shared them with others in small and large group presentations. Working with VYLI's faculty, staff and camp counselors they learned how to create action plans to stay focused on their goals during the summer months and school year. They gained courage by listening to teen leaders and adult mentors share their dreams, their stumbling blocks, and ways they overcame them. Each afternoon they participated in handson workshops: culinary arts, cultural arts & handicrafts, computers, music & theatre and swimming. In just one week, they accomplished a lot! Six young women experienced being a chef; six young men learned to swim; our young entrepreneurs made beautiful indigenous jewelry; our young actors produced a play; our musicians created VYLI's new themesong and performed it at our graduation and our technology group helped create this newsletter and an inspiring slide show featuring Summer Institute youth. Step-by-step, these young people began to pave the road to their own future.


An evening of great food, wine, event design, entertainment and exciting people who helped rise over \$6,000. We are very grateful to everyone who helped make this such an amazing event.

This year Vieques youth had a rich crosscultural exchange with young people from the British Virgin Islands, New York and Puerto Rico – as well as faculty from the Conservatory of Puerto Rico and Oregon. Members of the community shared their gifts as speakers, mentors, supporters, sponsors and businesses provided invaluable training. Viequense leader Carmen Portella Weir facilitated an interactive exchange with young people on teen pregnancy prevention. Each group presented their action plans for the new Vieques Youth Center to director, Cruz Belardo and the Mayor's representatives. The week culminated in a fabulous pool party at Ileana Cambo and Roberto Cacho's home. Nothing could top the pride we felt on Sunday as we watched our youth perform for their thrilled family and community members and receive their hard-earned graduation certificates!



Chef Kalich Padro and his staff were impressed when six motivated, young women arrived at the door to the Paso Fino kitchen at Martineau Bay Resort & Spa. After receiving a tour, the youth immediately started learning about the rigorous work that a chef faces every day. This great Culinary Arts Workshop made for a five-star experience! Tito recognized Phillip's great talent and said, "If you go back to school, you can join VYLI." That summer, Phillip checked out VYLI's Summer Institute. He then decided to go back to school - and discovered that he really liked COVEICO. Phillip was really proud on graduation day. He's now enjoying high school. This summer Phillip participated in the whole week-long Summer Institute, training with VYLI faculty from the Conservatory of Puerto Rico and then performing at graduation. Now he's working with VYLI, creating a better life for himself and learning to be a leader to help other Viegues youth. Building on Dr. Martin Luther King's vision: "Each one, teach one," each Camp Counselor worked hard everyday to help other teens learn how they, too, can make their dreams come true. For several months, they participated in weekly leadership sessions; developed action plans to pursue their own dreams and prepared powerful presentations on their progress. They recruited new candidates, even recording an announcement for the loud-speaker system that drives around the Island. They worked with Project Coordinator Kutasha Silva to make presentations to potential sponsors. On the first day of the Summer Institute, they patiently worked with new youth - helping them fill out their applications, inviting them to begin thinking about their dream for their life, their future and for the future of Vieques. During the week-long intensive, they helped implement VYLI's ground rules - be on time; stay focused on your goals and true to your dreams. They assisted VYLI faculty to maintain cultural sensitivity and maximize learning in the workshops. They worked as a team, building on each other's strengths and respecting differences; communicating concerns and troubleshooting challenges. They developed a strong work ethic - showing up every day from 8 am to 4 pm. - then participated in daily debriefings to discuss what worked and what needed improving for the next day. Most importantly, they served as role models for the other youth. At the Taste of the Islands, they inspired guests with presentations about their efforts to help build a new Viegues.

Rich Exchange with Vieques and BVI Youth

Last March Josué Cruz invited BVI Chief Minister Orlando Smith to send BVI youth to the VYLI 3rd annual Summer Institute. As a youth delegate in the first Vieques-Tortola Economic - Cultural Exchange, Josue's goal is to create a partnership between teens in Vieques and the British Virgin Islands. Josué was pleased to meet Gerry Obert, the first BVI representative from Jost Van Dyke. 13-year-old Gerry was accompanied by Spanish-speaking Emily Fletcher, The Mineshaft in Virgin Gorda from Puerto Rican descent. At first Gerry was a little shy, but enjoyed the warm welcome from Vieques youth. Having bi-lingual Josué as his Camp Counselor helped Gerry to overcome language barriers and make friends. His natural curiousity and eagerness for cultural experiences helped guarantee a wonderful week-long training. Gerry quickly became an Ambassador for the BVI, sharing stories about his small island in the BVI archepelago. home to just 3, 000 people. He was surprised that most people in Viegues weren't familiar with Jost Van Dyke (JVD). He'd read that people from JVD had traveled to Vieques in the 1920's to work on the sugar plantations. Vieques reminded Gerry of his mother's homeland of Grenada during the day and Trinidad at night.
